DID YOU KNOW?

Monash Children's at Southern Health provides a fully integrated primary, secondary and tertiary service to approximately a third of the state's child population. It also plays a central role in delivery of many specialities state wide.

We operate from three major hospitals serving newborn, child and adolescent needs. The internationally-renowned Monash Medical Centre Clayton operates the only tertiary paediatric service and paediatric intensive care unit in Victoria outside of the Royal Children's Hospital. It provides primary, secondary and all tertiary subspecialty services on an inpatient and outpatient basis. Casey and Dandenong Hospitals offer secondary level services including neonatal special care nurseries, general paediatrics and paediatric emergency services.

Our children's wards cater for a wide range of acute and chronic medical and surgical illnesses. The Paediatric Surgical Department covers care pre and post operatively, including general surgery, urology, plastics, neurosurgery, ear nose and throat and orthopaedics.

Paediatric Emergency includes primary assessment and management of acute illness. Monash Newborn manages the care of premature babies and includes one of only four neonatal intensive care facilities in Victoria.

Mental Health services include outpatient clinics to assess and manage mothers and their infants. The Early in Life Mental Health Service (ELMHS) also provides an inpatient and outpatient service for patients up to 18 years, and families experiencing emotional, behavioural and social difficulties.

... We are:

- The only designated hospital in Victoria for the highest levels of children's services other than the Royal Children's Hospital
- A paediatric referral centre for children from the Mornington Peninsula, Gippsland and the rest of Victoria
- Victoria's second largest children's hospital on volume
- Australia's third largest children's hospital on volume
- Part of Southern Health, Victoria's largest health service
- An international research centre as part of the renowned Monash Health Research Precinct with Monash University, Prince Henry's Institute and Monash Institute of Medical Research
- One of only four hospitals operating neonatal intensive care facilities in Victoria with Monash Newborn at Monash Medical Centre Clayton
- One of only three hospitals that provide Victoria's children's cancer service with our Children's Cancer Centre at Monash Medical Centre Clayton
- The only paediatric intensive care facilities in Victoria outside the Royal Children's Hospital
- The only Children's Sleep Centre in Victoria
- The only centre for treating paediatric Thalassaemia (genetic blood disorders)
- The only centre for foetal surgery in Victoria
- The only centre for paediatric cardiac electrophysiology.

... We have:

- One service over three sites offering 240 beds
- Over 100 years experience with children since our days as the Queen Victoria Hospital in Melbourne
- The only Ronald McDonald House on site in Victoria outside of the Royal Children's Hospital.

... We care for:

- Over 330,000 children aged 0 to 19 right where they live in south eastern Melbourne
- Over two thirds the children that the Royal Children's Hospital handles - and growing fast
- More than 56,000 children in our emergency departments last year
- Tens of thousands of children every year as outpatients
- Over 300 children with cancer in our Children's Cancer Centre each year, 30% of Victoria's cases
- A child diagnosed with cancer every week.

... Our plans include:

- Expanding our facilities at Monash Medical Centre Clayton with a new children's wing providing an additional 4 NICU beds, 5 PICU beds and 10 single rooms. These new beds will be available from February 2012.
- A new 240 bed Monash Children's Hospital to provide greater capacity to care for the children in the south east of Melbourne, Gippsland and the Mornington Peninsula in purpose-built child and family friendly facilities.

- Community based services supporting children and adolescents with chronic and complex needs and those who require rehabilitation.
